Refraction: The bending of the light when it travels from a fast to a slow medium.



Reflection off curved surfaces




Reflection, Transmission and Absorption

- Most important to the visual artist.
- What we perceive when light illuminate a scene
- This picture shows all 3 effects. At every step, there is loss of energy



When light (all colors)hits an object, what is reflected represent the color of the object
