Watercolor Still Life Presented by Matthew Bird Thursday, January 20, 2022 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. (via ZOOM)



The subject matter of my figure and still life paintings communicate my deep love and respect for nature and life. Some paintings stem from a joy or narrative that is from my own experiences. Other pieces reflect the simple beauty I find in everyday objects composed together. I have focused on developing my craft to capture the beauty of what surrounds me with precision and clarity; and strive to convey that to all people through the universal language of representational art. It is my desire that when others see my work they may be inspired by the perceptible signs of the real Creator.

Matthew Bird is an American painter. Born in Baltimore, Maryland, he graduated with honors from the Pratt Institute of Art in Brooklyn, New York, in 2000. He is a Signature Member of numerous organizations, including the National Watercolor Society where he served as vice president, and his award-winning watercolor paintings have been exhibited in juried shows across the United States, as well as in Canada, China, Greece, Hong Kong, and Italy. His work is in permanent museum collections as well as numerous private collections.

Matthew has been featured in *Fine Art Connoisseur* magazine as one of "Today's Masters" (Feb. & Oct. 2018, Feb. & April 2019), American Art Collector (Issue 158, 171), International Artist Magazine (No. 129 Oct./Nov.) Watercolor Magazine "Year's Best Paintings" (Feb. 2019) and as "One To Watch" (Dec. 2017), The Artist's Magazine (July/August 2017), The Art Of Watercolour magazine (Issue 32), and the Splash-Best of Watercolor book series. A sought-after teacher, Matthew has also been a contributing writer to numerous publications, including Realism Today, Fine Art Today, Artists on Art, and American Watercolor Weekly. For 15 years he worked as a designer and art director in advertising agencies, specializing in non-profit fundraising. As an illustrator, he has five children's books published and his paintings have been used as greeting cards for The Smithsonian Institution, National Geographic, the National Audubon Society, and the National Wildlife Federation, among others.

Matthew lives with his wife and children outside Baltimore, where he maintains his studio.



# Hedy Sanni is Lynnfield Art Guild's Featured Artist

The Lynnfield Art Guild (LAG) is proud to announce that local artist and member Hedy Sanni is the featured artist beginning on January 3, 2022 in the LAG website <u>www.lynnfieldarts.org</u>. The artist did not paint in earnest until she was ready to retire. She married young, had the good fortune to give birth to four healthy children and spent 13 years as a busy stay at home mom. In order to fulfill her creative spirit while managing many domestic and care-giving chores, Hedy taught herself sewing, knitting and gardening while taking art enrichment classes in the evenings including ceramics, drawing and sketching.

When all her children were enrolled in school, the artist worked in administrative positions, including at Tufts University where she was given the opportunity to take courses as an employee, eventually accumulating enough credits to earn a BA degree in Art History and an MA degree in Education. According to the artist: "As I learned about the different stages through which the art world progressed stylistically and creatively, my appreciation for all art grew. Throughout my educational journey, I marveled at the talent involved in the creation of sculpture, architecture and the fine art of painting in all mediums through hundreds of years of history."

When she tried her hand at painting to ease the loss of her husband, Hedy liked the feel and freedom of painting in watercolor and manipulating a small amount of pigment with water. "I got hooked almost immediately, although I didn't feel successful at first. Trial and error increased my confidence". After taking lessons from the late well-known watercolor artists Jack Jones and Pauline Bacon, Hedy currently studies with Lynn artist Bill Deveney.

"Seeing how other experts approached painting with the medium and taking classes with students exhibiting all levels and methods of painting gave me additional confidence and helped me develop



skills as I took note of different ways of handling my paints. I joined the Lynnfield Art Guild in order to continue my journey around like-minded people who take their art seriously. One of the benefits of the Guild is that it gives members this opportunity to place their paintings on a separate webpage within the LAG website. The ones I have put together are all watercolor, and encompass a variety of subject matter, many taken from my own photographs or still life set-ups. My very favorite paintings are buildings (the way light and shade glance off the structures), scenes including water (the change objects encounter as they interact with flowing or still water) and landscapes with the power and variety of green. I have also painted what I consider to be compositional challenges such as glassware, pottery, flower petals and animals." Many of her paintings are scenes of Lynnfield.
