

The Lynnfield Art Guild, a vibrant and diverse community of artists, artisans and art explorers, is hosting an exhibit at the Northshore Unitarian Universalist Church for the months of February and March. The exhibit features 40 pieces of fine art and photography by 13 Guild members, representing a variety of styles, mediums and themes.

The exhibit is open to the public on Sundays from 11:30am to 1:00pm. Admission is free, and all artwork is available for purchase.

There will be an artists' reception on **Sunday February 25th**, from 12pm to 2 pm - the public is welcome to attend.

About The Artist Emily is a painter of oils and acrylics, known for her expressive, loose style, without losing the sense of realism. In her work, she describes the beauty she finds in the ordinary, the everyday. She works from observation, both in the studio and plein air, and describes her work as 'a reaction to' the subject, as opposed to a 'rendering'. In addition to teaching oil and acrylic techniques, she encourages and teaches students to sketch. She says daily sketching is a great way to heighten one's ability to see, and important to incorporate into one's painting process, or to capture in a sketchbook, from nature. She is a member of The National Association of Women Artists, and her work is in galleries in New England and private collections internationally. After earning both a fine arts degree and a Master's in Education, she had a successful career as an educator and graphic designer. She teaches privately in her barn-studio, and at various educational venues near Boston.

The Guild wishes to thank photographer and author Joe Votano for his captivating demonstration to the Lynnfield Art Guild in January. He shared his insights and techniques on how to create stunning images in various genres, such as travel, architecture, surrealism, and street photography. He also explained his editing process and the tools he uses, such as Photoshop, Adobe Raw (Bridge), Artisan Pro, and Nik Filters. He showed examples of his work, which displayed his artistic vision and expression. The audience was impressed by his skill and diversity in his work and learned much from his presentation. Joe Votano is a member of the Merrimac Valley Camera Club and the Greater Lynn Photographic Association and has received numerous awards and publications for his photography. He has also published several phototravelogues and e-books, such as Boston Below, The Shaker Legacies, The Ever Changing Coastline, and The Timeless Seashore. 
