Reception for LAG @ NSUU - Sharing an Afternoon of Art

The Lynnfield Art Guild, a vibrant and diverse community of artists, artisans and art explorers, hosted a public reception for their exhibit at the Northshore Unitarian Universalist Church on Sunday, February 25th. The exhibit features 44 pieces of fine art and photography by 14 Guild members, representing a variety of styles, mediums and themes.

About 50 people attended the reception and enjoyed the beautiful art exhibit and the company of the Guild and NSUU members.

Oil Paint Presented by Christopher Volpe Thursday, March 21, 2024 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. (via Zoom)

Art is just an attempt to create meaning, both in your own individual life and in the lives of the people you connect with. What keeps me coming back to the easel is a perpetual unrest and an urge to be part of a collective search for meaning and satisfaction. It's the same impulse I had as a teacher of literature – an attempt to make some sense of what's going on and figure out what's important before we die.

The paintings I love and aspire to create turn the pain and confusion of being human into a kind of beauty that doesn't deny the darkness or sugarcoat reality, yet insists on a lyrical engagement, not just with the world around us, but with the deeper mysteries of the human heart.

During March, a selection of oil and acrylic landscape paintings by

Wakefield-based artist Leslie Scott-Lysan is on exhibit at the Blake Gallery at the Lucius Beebe Memorial Library, 345 Main Street in Wakefield, MA. The exhibit is titled "New England Views: En Plein Air & In the Studio."

Leslie's 2006 vacation to Monhegan Island (ME) spurred her return to painting after being away from it for over 30 years. The artists there inspired her to buy watercolor pencils, paper, and brushes to sketch a rusted, white iron bucket of bright red geraniums at the Monhegan House.

Today, she draws inspiration from colors and light and nature in every

season, whether it is from a grand vista in the White Mountains (NH), the rocky shores and mountains in Maine, or her home studio. Even city architecture fascinates her. Making art for Leslie is "about color, light, and working alongside the Creator."

She works primarily en plein air (outdoors) in oil and acrylic paints as well as mixed media. Her photography offers inspiration for her studio work.






LAG is proud to announce that Lynnfield watercolor artist and active member,

Catherine Grassello is a Wakefield resident who


